Full Steam Ahead with our Priority Area-Mathematics and Numeracy

Parents will be pleased to know that we have made a good start with our focus on Mathematics and Numeracy. Here are some of the things we have done:

- all classroom teachers attended training in Mathematics on Friday, 22nd January, before school began;
- a staff meeting was used for planning in Mathematics, and another staff meeting for planning Week 8;
- Toni Burford our new coordinator of Mathematics and Numeracy has been working with SSOs and teachers to introduce the QuickSmart program, a catch up program for students falling behind with their number skills in Years 5 7;
- all teachers, R- 7 are now programming and teaching 5 hours per week for mathematics and numeracy;
- 4 classes were involved in International Maths day competitions, competing with students from other countries in number quizzes online.
