Giving our Children the Mindset to Succeed (Part 2)

Last term I wrote about how the feedback we give to children helps to form their beliefs about the way they learn. Feedback which acknowledges how and why their work is good, or exactly how or why their work needs to improve is likely to help them achieve in the future. We want to avoid feedback that will give students the belief that they achieved because they are smart, or that they didn't achieve because they are not smart.

Current research shows clearly that some students think they learn because they are smart (or intelligent) and that intelligent is fixed... you are either smart or you are not smart. You can learn new things, but you can't change how smart you are. These are the children who do not do so well in the long term. Although they may start out achieving well, when the work gets hard, or when difficulties arise, they are easily discouraged, and may fall into the trap of thinking that there is no point putting in the effort, because they are not smart.

Students who believe that you can get smarter, do better when they encounter difficulties. They have found that through effort and learning, they can improve their ability and are more likely to try hard, persist, and work tough to reach their goal. They are the ones most likely to succeed.

What you say really does matter -an example from the classroom.

What did you say when your child failed or didn't do well in a maths assignment?

- ...Did you say "You didn't do very well in this assignment but:
- ... it must be the teacher, they are not good at explaining things."
 - ... that's ok, I was never any good at maths!"
- ... just tell me if you got an A that's all I want to know."

...I can see that you didn't understand how to calculate area. Three of the errors you made were about area, and you didn't multiply length by width. Why don't we go to the teacher before school tomorrow, and see if they can help you with this some more."

Feedback that is specific will help children perform better next time, and help them develop the mindset of a champion*. Giving specific feedback is a challenge for both teachers and parents, and is one that we need to work on together.

NATIONAL LITERACY AND NUMERACY
TESTS

On 11,12 & 13 May, our students will be sitting the annual Literacy and Numeracy tests. Despite the industrial action, which will effect our school, principals have been instructed to ensure that the tests go ahead, and to ensure they are administered as smoothly for students as possible. We therefore will go ahead with the tests. These LAN tests give teachers and parents a picture of how a student's achievement compares with other students within the state and across the country. Students in Year 3, 5 and 7, will combine to sit the test, with one teacher administering the test, and others taking the students in Years 2, 4 & 6. Test Times:

The Numeracy Test for Year 7 students has two parts. Part A, before recess, calculator may **not** be used. Part B, after recess, calculator to be used.
