

Please be aware of the school's nut policy. All Parent/Caregivers are requested NOT to send food to school that contains nuts (especially peanuts and cashews). This includes peanut paste, nutella, all nuts and cooking oil containing peanut oil, as well as foods containing nuts. This is especially important in the Junior Primary Unit, where young children are less able to manage their allergy. Note that many snack bars and muesli bars contain nuts.





Mathletics at home

Our school is now a member of the popular maths site: **Mathletics**. Your child and family may have tried it before when we participated in World Maths Day earlier this year. **All students from years 1 - 7** will have access both at school and home for the remainder of their year and all of 2011. Students can access the Mathletics site from home once they have been given their personal username and password from their class teacher. The site includes a speed challenge, as well as a range of activities matched to specific content areas and different skill levels. Teachers can select activities for students to access at home and choose topics to match what is being

As this programme is new to most teachers at our school, an introductory session will be run for them this week. 
