Children from Inverbrackie at our School?

Parents in our community are aware that there will be children living at Inverbrackie, near Woodside, which will be used to house Asylum Seekers while their claims for refugee status are being processed. These children and their families will be there for short term periods, approximately 3—6 months. When they leave, other children and families will come. It is possible that some of these children will be educated in local schools in our region, and in fact many schools, both public and private have expressed a willingness to have some children attend. Our school will have an extra classroom space next year. At our recent Governing Council Meeting on Monday 29 November, Governing Council expressed in principle support to have 15-20 children from Inverbrackie attend Littlehampton Primary School. It is our understanding that these children would attend some part of the day in mainstream classrooms, and some part of the day receiving intensive ESL lessons in their own classroom. It is by no means certain that we will be asked to take these children, however Governing Council has expressed willingness to take these students should we be asked, and should proper resources and other support be provided.
