# **Urgent- Staff Car Park Danger**

This week we had a serious incident in the staff car park on Baker Street. A student leaving school at the end of the day rode his bike along the disabled path in the school grounds and then into the staff car park, and was hit by a car entering the staff car park. Fortunately he was not seriously hurt, but this is an important reminder to us all how important it is to address the safety of the students. Staff and parents have observed many 'near-misses' in the car park. Here are some examples of what has been observed:

- A toddler ran ahead of her mum, into the path of a reversing car.
- A student running unaccompanied through the car park to get to his parent's car (parked on Baker street) was almost hit by a car leaving the car park.
- Two children on bikes taking a short cut through the car park were almost hit by a car.
- Children walking through the car park after school were too short to be seen by the driver reversing, and were almost hit.

### Could any of these reported near-misses apply to you or your child?

As parents and teachers we need to be so mindful that even the most sensible children will sometimes act impulsively. Please take the time to reflect on your child's entry and exit to and from the school.

The safest entrance to the school from Baker Street is through the pedestrian gates directly in front of the front office.



We are not able to block off access through the staff car park, but we consider this unsafe for parent and student access to the school. **Students riding bikes must exit the school through the gate near the Friendship Seat.** Please also remember that the staff car park is only for staff to use even if there are spaces available, as we have staff coming and going throughout the day.
