Kitchen Garden Program off to a Great Start



It has been just wonderful to be a part of the launch of the new Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden program these past two weeks. A highlight of the program has been the community spirit evidenced in so many ways: volunteers willing to give up their own



time for the children, mums with toddlers helping in the garden, families dropping by the kitchen to deliver goods to stock the pantry, letters pledging donations arriving at the front office. What an exciting time here at LPS! And now introducing Lucy and Sam:



My name is Lucy Cahill and I am the new Garden Specialist for the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Program. I live on several acres just outside the township of Lobethal where with my partner Bert and two children, have been growing our own fruit and vegetables, including preserving and drying for over 10 years. As you are probably now well aware, garden classes started last week and the students, staff, volunteer parents and myself all had such fun exploring, planting, harvesting, watering, digging and weeding. We can't wait to start our next adventures, growing and learning together in the kitchen garden.

It is with a warm heart that I say thank you to the families and members of the broader community who have recently donated cash and many goods to the SAKG. Some garden products include: • Almost a \$1000 donation of Garden tools, wheel barrows, compost bin, secateurs and much

more from Mitre 10 Mount Barker

• Several dozen punnets of seedlings, including asparagus and artichoke from Lasscocks Mount Barker Garden Centre and the Rose Family which has helped kick start this season's plantings

- Compost Bin from the Elliot Family
- Eggshells, horse manure and seed travs

Children have been asked to remember **raincoats** and a **change of shoes or wellington boots** for their garden class on those drizzly days and to bring along dry egg shells and shredded paper/newspapers for the garden.

As the garden is still growing and changing a **working bee** is planned for Sunday **May 29th** which could include such jobs as installing additional garden beds, trellising to fences, installing a hot house and mulching garden paths. There are still some items that would be great to receive (secondhand in good condition is fine) so please check your cupboards and see if you can spare any of the following:

- Wicker/cane baskets in a variety of sizes,
- Cutlery and Crockery bowls, dinner plates, bread plates,
- Electric blender,
- Electric food processor,
- Glass storage jars for dry pantry goods (with a good seal),
- Any old, interesting or quirky kitchen equipment for display i.e. hand beaters, butter pats, sieves etc

Please leave all donations in the kitchen along with a post-it note with your name and phone number, and state whether or not you would like items returned to you should we receive lots of the same item.

Kitchen classes are due to begin in Week 4, so if you would like to be involved please leave your name and preferred times with Margie Sarre at the front office.

And finally, if your child has any allergies or serious food intolerances I would like to have a chat with you to make sure our sessions are as safe and inclusive as possible. ## Walk Safely to School Day Friday 20th May



Well it's that time of year again when our school seriously starts talking about walking! Walk Safely to School Day asks that we all consider our transport habits and try to incorporate more walking as part of a healthy, active way to get around. And although walking all

the way to school isn't realistic for many of us, it's quite easy to figure out how you can build a walk into your family's daily routine.

You can teach your child the healthy habit of walking more by:

- Walking with them the whole way to school if they get the bus or train, walk past your usual stop and get on at the next stop.
- If you have to drive, park the car a few blocks away from the school and walk the rest of the way.

Regular exercise like walking with your child not only helps them (and you!) beat chronic problems like obesity, heart disease, behavioural and mental health issues and diabetes. It also gives you a great opportunity to teach your child safe ways to behave around roads and traffic.

We are hoping to have as many students and staff from Littlehampton Primary School as possible walk to school next Friday. Students who walk will get a sticker to wear once they get to school. ## **Bully Audit**

The table below shows the results of the recent school Bully Audit for Term 1.

Students in R-Year 7 are encouraged to name any students they have been bullied by, or have seen bullying others. The surveys are anonymous, so students feel safe in being honest and open about what is happening. Students who are named on 4 or more students' sheets are supported with counselling to help them to realise how their behaviour is affecting others, and ultimately themselves. We have found this program to be very effective in reducing incidents of bullying at this school.

This term the figures are very low for bullying in comparison to other years, particularly in the classroom. I have included the data from Term 1 last year as a comparison. It is fantastic to see that the vast majority of students are feeling so safe here at school.
