## News from the Kitchen

The kitchen has been a hive of activity this term, as the students become more at home in the kitchen and develop greater confidence with their cooking skills. Our menus this term have started off with an Italian theme, which has been very well received, with lots of requests for seconds (and thirds!) Mediterranean cuisines suit our climate so perfectly, and there are so many simple and
 delicious dishes that we can create with the produce that we have grown in our garden. This past fortnight, busy hands have been stirring pumpkin risotto, shaping orecchiette pasta, chopping broccoli and other greens and baking Italian lemon biscuits.

For those of you who have not yet been involved in a kitchen class, a session involves the class dividing into groups and creating five dishes which are brought together at the end of the class to share as a meal (of tasting size). The students are responsible for all aspects of bringing the food to
 the table - from preparation and cooking to setting tables, washing dishes and folding tea towels.
Students stay in the same groups for the year, so as to allow everyone to prepare a variety of dishes and to develop a range of skills. They are also each working on their own recipe book, which is a record of the dishes that they have cooked throughout the year. Generous donations. I continue to be amazed and delighted by the generosity of this community - from the time given by the wonderful people who come and help out with kitchen classes, to the donations of produce, money and equipment from individuals and businesses. Just recently, we received a beautiful new KitchenAid Stand Mixer, as a gift from KitchenAid to Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden program schools.


As you would be aware, the involvement of volunteers is
 essential to the program. We are still needing more people in some of our classes, so if you or anyone you know is interested in helping out please contact the school.

## KISS \& DROP FEEDBACK

We would like to take this opportunity to thank families for being so understanding and 'cooperative with our new 'Kiss and Drop' and parking procedures.
It is always difficult to make changes to habits we have formed over time, and I know many of you would thave had to re-think the way you pick up and drop off Iyour children. You may have changed the time you |arrive, whether or not you park and walk to pick up your children, which road to pick up kids from, and leven which road you arrive at school on, in order to ibe driving the right direction to pick up kids safely.
How do I know this? Because I am one of the !parents who has had to do this too! My husband Greg and I worked out that we now have to travel further Ialong Princes Highway towards Mt Barker (coming from Nairne) and turn up West Terrace at the |roundabout, so that we are travelling in the correct |direction to pull into the "Kiss and Drop' on William Street to get our son Oscar.
I Jenny and I have been monitoring the situation, and talking to the teachers on duty. It is running
generally very smoothly, and usually drivers only 'have to wait a very short time, if at all, to pick up their children.
There are just a couple of safety issues we ask parents to be aware of;

1. Please do not make U-turns on Baker street or William St in order to pick up or drop off children. This creates a dangerous situation for pedestrians and other drivers .
2. We are not allowing students to be picked up on the opposite side of the road. Please only arrive at school travelling in the direction that allows you to pull in and pick up children form the 'Kiss and Drop' zones.

## Making Maths fun

There are many commercial board games that involve counting money, collecting points, adding dice and working out how to win. These games all develop important maths skills for a real purpose in a fun way. Help your child choose games for their lpods, DS and computers that encourage the use of logic and some problem solving.
Some examples are:

- Monopoly involves adding amounts and working our change.
- Chess and draughts are great for talking about logical thinking, direction and movement.
- Yahtzee is a helpful and fun game that uses multiplication or repeated addition to work out the score
- Card games like 21 and Rummy are great for adding up numbers in your head.

## Did you know

One of the best ways for your child to learn about decimals is to use money and measurements.
Get you child to help you shop, cook and measure. Do they know?
$\$ 2.75$ is more than $\$ 2$ but less than $\$ 3$.
2.5 metres is 2 metres and point 5 or half of the next metre-it's 2 metres and 50 centimetres.
1.25 litres is more than one litre and less than one and a half litres. It's one litre and point 25 of a litre or a quarter of the next litre.
