# **Our students – how active are they?**

In Term 2, most of our Year 6/7 students participated in action research for a PhD study to identify the factors that influence lunchtime and after school activity. This involved wearing an 'accelerometer' to measure physical activity levels at different times of the day, and completing 3 questionnaires about physical activity.

## We think you will agree that the results were very interesting:

- Girls and boys were much more physically active at school during lunchtime compared to after school.
- Approximately half of the children monitored were not meeting the daily recommended 60 minutes of physical activity. As a group they obtained 42% (girls) - 58% (boys) of the recommended levels.
- Boys were more physically active than girls, both at lunch (35% boys, 21% girls) and after school (14% boys, 11% girls). The 3 most common activities for boys at lunch (in order) were running, 'mucking around outdoors' and walking around. The most common activities for girls were sitting (talking, reading, writing), walking around and mucking around outdoors.
- The most common activities after school for boys were watching TV. Computer console games and running/jogging, whereas the three most common activities for girls were studying / homework, watching TV and sitting (talking/eating / reading).
- Compared to 9 other schools in the study, our students were more active at lunchtime at school than other schools, and less active after school.

Overall, the children said they preferred being active rather than sedentary and would like to take part in more organised sports and activities after school.

#### The students said the main reasons they were not more active after school were:

- Homework and household chores stop them from being active.
- They are more likely to be active if they have a friend with them.
- Rain can limit their activity. •
- Parents are supportive of them being active, but are generally too busy to play with them.

Interestingly, students felt they had adequate play space and equipment both at school and at home, and cost or distance (from parks, ovals, etc) were not factors in determining how active they were. Although students did not list TV or Computers as an issue, clearly the time they are spending on these activities is impacting on their physical activity as well.

As a staff we are committed to encouraging as much physical activity as possible. The difference in activity choices between girls and boys is of particular interest, and we will attempt to address this next year. Students stated that they play sport at school to improve their skills and to be considered 'cool' by their peers. Peers support was identified as being very important to them. So one challenge for us will be to try to make physical activity more 'cool' for girls!

Another challenge as a community would be to get more of our students walking and riding their bikes to school. We are beginning a new program next year called Way2Go, which teaches traffic and pedestrian safety and encourages children to be more active before and after school. Stay tuned for activity sheets to come with your newsletter next year.

# Change in our Bushfire Policy

Approved by Governing Council in the Meeting on 5th December 2011. Our previous Bushfire policy read "all excursions will be cancelled on days of Total Fire Ban". This is now no longer a requirement of DECD. The policy now reads, "On Days of Total Fire Ban, excursions are cancelled at the Principal's discretion." Note, this is talking about Days of Total Fire Ban, NOT Days of Code Red Catastrophic Weather Conditions. On Code Red Catastrophic Days, all excursions will be cancelled.

Total Fire Ban days occur reasonably frequently, and we have already had one such day this year. Under the previous policy swimming lessons at Woodside pool were cancelled. Under the new policy this is unlikely to happen unless there is a fire in the vicinity.

# Change in our Uniform Policy

Please find included with this newsletter the **new uniform** policy, which has been approved by the Governing Council. Please note that students can still wear their current logo items (eg school jumpers) next year, as there will be a long 'phase in' period'. The Uniform Shop will be preparing the new items (eg polar fleece jackets) to be ready early in Term 1 2012.
