Mt Barker High School

Feedback from Interviews Thankyou to all the parents who made time to visit teachers during our Parent- Teacher Interview week. From teacher reports we know that fewer than 20 parents across the school did not make a time to meet with teachers. Thankyou to the teachers for their many additional hours of work during this time. For those teachers who had "3 way interviews", where the students themselves were involved in discussions, you will receive a feedback sheet early next term. We are seeking parents' opinions about the effectiveness of the interviews from your point of view. Helen Forrest passed on this feedback, gleaned during interviews with parents new to the school:

Mrs Forrest: I've had parents express on 3 separate occasions that they are overwhelmed by the sense of community at LPS. Not just from the school as a whole but the way teachers interact with each other and are so caring. One parent said that when he chose Littlehampton Primary School he was expecting his child to get an education but not for the whole family to feel so welcomed and a part of the school.

We hope that this has been your experience too. Building our community is one of the priorities on our Site Improvement Plan this year, and this is what we aim for.

Good News Stories from Mt Barker High School

1. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

During the Christmas Holidays significant work occurred to improve the physical environment to the inside and outside of the school. These improvements included re-carpeting the upstairs areas, carpeting the Hall, placing glass partitions into a number of classrooms, replacing student lockers in the Middle School areas and painting lockers the Senior School areas. Visitors to the school will also notice new signage, painting of the breezeway, paving of walkways and the construction of a new Bus/Outdoor Education Shed. Over the last two weeks much of the exterior of the school has begun to be painted and this has seen a huge improvement with the brightness when entering the school premises.

2.POSITIVE EDUCATION

Thinkers in Residence: Dr Martin Seligman

It is with pleasure that I am able to announce that Mount Barker High School has been selected as the only Government school to work with the Thinkers in Residence Program. This is an outstanding accolade for the school and the work that we do with young people. Parent Complaint Policy

Parent guide to raising a concern or complaint:

We all expect quality and expert care and teaching for your child in order that they achieve their potential. Working together will give us the best chance of solving a problem that may arise during your child's years in preschool and school. We also recognise that at times things may go wrong. If you have a concern or a complaint, we want you to let us know. It's important to learn from mistakes or misunderstandings so that we can improve your child's experience and learning, and also improve processes where possible.

The first step

Talk to your child's teacher, and then the principal or deputy principal if you still are not happy.

Ask at the front office for a copy of the school & preschool's *Parent Guide to Raising a Concern or Complaint* brochure. Steps guiding how complaints should be made are explained in the brochure.

Use this guide to help you think through what you are concerned about and how to resolve the matter respectfully and effectively.

About complaints or concerns

This information may be helpful in explaining what a complaint is: A complaint may be made by a parent if they think that the school has, for example:

- done something wrong
- failed to do something it should have done
- acted unfairly or impolitely.

Your concern or complaint may be about:

- the type, level or quality of services
- the behaviour and decisions of staff
- a policy, procedure or practice.

Sometimes a complaint is about something we have to do because of State or federal law. In such cases we are able to talk to you about the matter and help you understand the requirements and why they exist. Australian Schools Competitions

The competitions are conducted through the University of New South Wales Educational Testing Centre, and are for Primary students from Years 3 to Year 7 in Science, Writing, Spelling, Mathematics and English. The competitions provide opportunities for students to be assessed in an external testing situation and are also used to recognise and reward achievement. Students can enter any number of competitions, however, entry fees must be lodged by the due date (see below). If your child is interested in an extra challenge, then this is a great opportunity. The dates for the competitions are:
