

rely on many parents to volunteer with our school programs, so there are lots of parent volunteers in the school on any given day. For children's safety, we need to know what parents are at school and why. Here is a reminder about our processes. We are sure all parents and volunteers want to do the right thing so we can ensure the safety of all.

Student safety.



Parents who volunteer to help in classrooms, we need you! There is no need to sign in at the front office and no need to wear a visitors badge. Parents who help in their own child's class can contact the class teacher, and carry out duties as instructed by the teacher, largely under the teachers eye (ie not working a distance from the teacher). We currently don't require police checks for parents in this situation. Teachers are responsible for ensuring any contact with students is appropriate, and will talk to the parent and Principal in the rare cases where there could be inappropriate contact. This would also apply for parents working in the library.

Parents or others who volunteer for LAP, Multilit, or Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Program will need to have police checks if working with students without direct supervision of a teacher. (Non-parents for SAKG need to have police checks.) All parents in this category to sign in at the front office as visitors.

Parents contacting or collecting their children during school time

While coming to school to talk to your children during the school day for personal reasons is discouraged, (after all we do not wish to interrupt the learning program); we recognise that this is unavoidable sometimes.

- Our system is that parents must call in at the front office, not go directly to classrooms.
- Children are never sent home from the classroom. They are sent to the front office to meet parents there and to be signed out by a parent in the front office.
- Please go to the front office if you are collecting children early or need to see your children for any other reason. Maree will then ring the class teacher to send your children down or will give parents a pass to be taken to the classroom if contact is necessary.



• This pass will be left with the classroom teacher.

There have been a few instances which have caused difficulty for teachers when parents or other adults have gone directly to the classroom and sought contact with children. We want to make sure our processes ensure children's safety, and we are sure this is what you want too.

Parents in the School, Class or Yard- contact with children other than their own. Children benefit from having positive connections with many adults in our school community. I'm sure you've heard the saying, it takes a village to raise a child. Friendly greetings and chats with children you may know in the school ground are always welcome. A quick direction if you see a child in danger is also appropriate.

Police Band Performance



The Police Band will be performing at our school on Thursday March 22nd (week 8) at 1:45pm—2:30pm. The performance includes music from well known movies and TV shows. Incorporated into the show are police safety messages, ranging from small-wheeled vehicle road safety,

personal safety, emergency phone numbers and internet safety.

There is <u>NO COST</u>. If however, you DO NOT wish your child to be involved please send a note to your child's classroom teacher.

to drop off children, or pick up children who are already standing near the exit on Baker Street. Please do not use this space to pull in and wait for your child to arrive. If you would like to have a place to park and wait, we suggest arranging another pick-up point with your child, such as on Darnley or William Street.
