What a great time we had last Friday, June 22nd. Maggie Beer and Simon Bryant visited our school to officially open our Stephanie Alexander Kitchen garden Program! It was wonderful to see so many of our families come out on such a wet and wild afternoon. We were so pleased to be able to acknowledge our 60 regular volunteers and also thank our generous sponsors of the program. Year 6/7 student tour

guides took visitors on tours of our program, visiting stations around the school where students were actively involved in cooking (see items below), gardening (planting, making seed trays and harvesting) and doing kitchen garden art activities (mosaic stepping stones and harvest paintings). All of the staff were really proud

of the students who were working in these roles; they did such a professional job! Maggie Beer and Simon Bryant were genuinely very impressed with our school and the program. They admired our 'bright warm welcoming' kitchen and couldn't believe how healthy and prolific the garden was at this time of year. Simon wished his Kale could look like ours! They enjoyed tasting food prepared by the students-



caramelised onion tarts, spinach and ricotta rolls, lentil larp and Asian pumpkin dips. Ben Taylor of the SAKG Foundation was especially impressed with our volunteers. He commented on the 'obvious strong community spirit' here at Littlehampton Primary School, which he believed would be the envy of other schools. Watching the many parents happily working together helping in the kitchen to serve soup,



cakes and Mexican hot chocolate during the event, we have to agree! Thank you so much to our families who donated soup and muffins / cakes... we raised almost \$600 and a further \$100 from the Garden Stall. We would also like to thank the students for decorating the school with homemade lanterns and the staff for all their hard work. Congratulations to all for a great day!


We keep safe You bet! Have you heard about the Mt Barker Show We won prizes for carrots, beetroot and potatoes

Tool and wheelbarrow licenses we get


Harvesting is great fun
