Wipe Out Waste Forum Update

Thank you to all the students, parents and staff who have made such quick and incredible changes to the waste levels of waste materials. ALL classrooms are reporting huge reductions in the waste materials levels being produced in their classroom every day. Most classrooms are close to or are achieving the 300 ml miniature wheelie bin limit each day - Great work! Some classrooms have a large majority of students achieving waste free status every day. These results are showing us what a significant difference we can really make. Thank you to those who have already returned the survey sent home to every family last week, please keep them coming. We need to collect data for evidence and to justify the funds we are receiving to supply two reusable plastic food containers to every student in the school. The purchase of those is progressing and we look forward to sending them home soon. It is rewarding to know that others recognise the significance of what we are doing and to then invest money in our initiative and success. Data collected also, importantly, informs our school community of the levels of our progress and the success we are having.
