We Value Your Opinion-Parent Opinion survey


Earlier in the year, randomly selected parents received a letter from DECD inviting them to participate in the Parent Opinion Survey. We always find the response disappointing on online surveys, and this is partially due to DECD selecting what we consider to be too small a group of sample families This year 25 parents responded. Last year, we posted paper versions of the surveys to all school families, and more than 100 responded!

We thank those parents who responded because even with the limited response, we are able to gain a picture of how parents think we are going as a school, compared with our region and compared with the state.

In these graphs, scores have been calibrated to give an average of 10, and the two lines on each bar show where the 25th percentile and 75th percentile. Our school's average score is shown as a black diamond.

You will notice that our parents this year rated us higher compared with than parents rated other schools across the Adelaide Hills Region, and even higher than the average responses across the state. Our parents rated us highest for support of learning. See over the page for the questions in this section.

The responses from the staff survey, with a higher than 50% response by staff, showed similar high results. Our staff rated us especially high for relationships and communication.

The results for the student survey were not as high compared with state and and regional averages. We are not complacent, and are always looking at ways we can improve. Some issues we need to address from the individual comments are:

- Electronic Communication... what is happening? *Electronic newsletters have commenced and statistics show a 50% read rate.*
- Teacher absence due to T&D other issues Addressed on next page.
- Key personnel out of school together Yes, sorry, this did happen this year and is not ideal
- Parent perceptions re bullying Despite our best efforts, there is still some parent concern.
- Student comments "My teacher screams very loud". This needs to be addressed, as teachers and parents alike want communication between teachers and students to be respectful. Further investigation will take place.



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Parent Surveys cont....

Also of interest was one parent response questioning our practice of giving awards for Progress and Achievement in the NAPLAN tests. This was discussed by both Governing Council and staff. While not unanimous, it was decided that we will continue to recognise our academic achievers in this way. Apart from the Garth Boomer literacy award given to a Year 7 student, it is the only way we recognise our high achievers. Students making high progress are acknowledged equally, and it is a delight to see some students gaining awards for high progress who have struggled in the past. We recognise sporting achievement, achievement in arts and music, citizenship skills, leadership, and demonstrating our school values on a regular basis. We consider it important that we recognise academic achievement too.

A few parents have commented that there seem to be lots of TRTs in the school. For some classes this has been higher than others. Teacher absence for illness or tragedy is a situation that we would never wish on any staff member, and leave for these purposes is a HR condition. We find that releasing teachers in a planned way to attend Training and Development or for collaborative planning with other teachers is a practice highly valued by teachers, and one which has a great effect on classroom programs and learning outcomes for students. We have managed the situation this year by planning for Margie Sarre or trusted teachers who work often in our school to provide release, which helps with stability for the classes.

The questions from the survey below are those in the section which deals with support of learning. Questions in green are the questions where our average parents response was 20% better than the average state response.

- 1 My child is motivated to learn at this school.
- 2 My child's teachers provide help and support when it is needed
- **3** My child has access to quality materials and resources that help him/her to learn.
- 4 My child is happy at this school this year.
- 5 My child would receive support for any special needs he/she had.
- **6** The school changes its programs and activities to improve student achievement.
- 7 Students know how they are expected to behave at school.
- **8** Overall, I am satisfied with the management of facilities at the school.
- 9 This school provides a safe and secure environment. 10 Students have enough materials and resources for their learning.
- 11 This school has information available about other agencies within the community.
- 12 This school encourages students to have a sense of pride in their achievement.
