On Monday our Governing Council met for the second time this year. ## **Procedure Approved- Complaints Procedure**

Parents would be aware that our school, in line with DECD, has a new complaints policy. A copy of the brochure Parent Guide to raising a concern or complaint was mailed to all parents in December 2012, and copies are available at the front office, and on the school website.

Schools are also required to have and follow an agreed procedure for dealing with complaints, and our procedure was approved by Governing Council on 18 March. Please note that a copy of the complaint form and procedure are on our school website. Parents can print and fill in the two lines "Name of person raising the complaint" and "Overview of the Complaint" themselves if they wish, and hand to a teacher or to staff at the front office, who will ensure the complaint resolution process is completed. Most times, staff will ask parents, "Would you like to make a complaint?" and assist parents in writing the complaint. Therefore the procedure gives advice to teachers about when to use the form.

#### **Site Procedures for Dealing with Parent Complaints**

Please read in conjunction with *Parent Guide to raising a concern or complaint* leaflet (copies kept in Front Office).

All aspects of the concern/complaint must be clearly documented. This procedure begins with the person who is the *FIRST POINT OF CONTACT* and the attached pro-forma should be used.

All documentation should be kept in the PARENT CONCERNS AND COMPLAINTS folder in the Principal's office.

Parents often come to the class teacher as a first port of call when they are unhappy about something. Often the issue can be resolved with a simple conversation. In this case no documentation is required.

#### Please Use the Complaint form when:

- the issue is not resolved in the meeting (one way to clarify this is to ask the parent "Are you happy that we've resolved this, is there anything you would like me to do?");
- if you have concerns about the issue (eg note in the diary, emotional issue) please involve the Principal or Deputy and begin the complaint form;
- if it is a repeat concern even about a minor issue.

All concerns/complaints must be actioned within a reasonable timeframe and the parent must be made aware of when they can expect a response. Ordinarily, contact should be made within 24 hours. This does not mean that the issue will necessarily be resolved within 24 hours, but that the parent has been informed of the next stage in the process. The following guidelines are in the DECD Parent concerns and complaint procedures:

- Class teacher makes a time within 5 working days to meet with parent.
- For complaints brought to Principal or Deputy Principal, acknowledgement of receipt of complaint in writing (this can be via email) within 5 working days or meet within 5 working days. The teacher, principal or deputy principal will write a summary of the outcome on the form during discussion with the parent and will sign and date to show finalisation.

#### What to do with the form.

When the teacher has met with the parent, note agreements on the form and sign, pass on to the principal. Complaint forms are stored in the Principal's office.

This document was ratified at a Governing Council meeting on 18 March 2013.

## No Policy on Hugs at School

Littlehampton Primary School does not have a policy on hugs at school. Some confusion arose when staff were dealing with issues of inappropriate hugging with the Year 6/7 classes, and a letter has been sent to all Year 6/7 parents clarifying the situation. Teachers have talked to students in all classes R-7 clarifying the situation.

All children throughout the school will be learning about trust as part of the Child Protection curriculum. In this context teachers will talk to children about levels of people for physical contact. For example hugs may be appropriate for immediate family members, aunts and uncles and close friends but not for strangers or acquaintances. Kisses may be appropriate for immediate family members, aunts and uncles and very close family friends, but not for school mates or mores distant friends. When this is taught in school, information will be sent home to parents and we will encourage parents to talk to their children about it, as views on exactly when a kiss or hug is appropriate will vary between families.

### **Dogs on School Ground**

At Parents and Friends and Governing Council the issue of dogs on the school grounds was raised. At busy times of the day when parents are gathering around entrances to buildings to drop or collect their children, some parents had felt they and their toddlers were frightened or intimidated by dogs in these crowded areas.

Governing Council has taken a balanced point of view to this issue. We endorse the community –friendly activity of families walking to school (with their dogs). We would ask parents who bring dogs into the school to please follow the following guidelines:

- The dog owner is responsible for their dog at all times. Ensure your dog is on a leash and not left unattended. (Please don't tie up your dogs and leave them).
- Please do not bring your dog to entrances and exits where large numbers of parents gather, and children walk by as they leave/enter school. Consider waving your children goodbye from a less busy section of the school yard, or agreeing to meet them there.
- Please do not allow your dog to interact with other dogs.
   If your dog is barking or showing aggression to another dog please move them out of the school grounds.
- No dogs at school events, for example Sports Day.
- If your child would like to bring their pet to show and tell, please arrange with the classroom teacher well in advance, so that children can be settled and interact with the dog in a safe manner.

At all times we encourage students to talk to the dog owner and ask permission before patting a dog.
