When Will I Grow Wings?



Last Thursday 26 of our Year Six students attended a full day workshop of drawing and sculpture making at historic Carclew House in North Adelaide. They each made a 'critter' inspired by a poem they had written in an earlier workshop with spoken word artist Amelia Walker.

'Wings can take you anywhere', the students imagined and that was certainly evident once students had completed

their exciting sculptures. A hall in Carclew House was set up with a 'word shop' where students made a plastic bubble with a line from their poem written on it. There was 'the shop' where a huge collection of materials were available for students to choose from to make their critter. There was the 'workshop' where artist James Parker used power tools to cut shapes for students. There was a 'glue gun workshop' where students could glue their works, and assisting with decisions on what to use and how to use it was Sally Heinrich, also a professional artist. We were told by the artists that of the four schools involved in the program, our students made the most creative, colourful and the most diverse art works. The plastic bubbles, the drawings made at the workshop and the critter sculptures are now strung together in the foyer of the Playhouse Theatre using a wide array of twine, rope, ribbon, chain and cord. It will be open to everybody to see throughout the Come Out Festival season between the 22nd May and the 31st May. It is all very curious, but guaranteed to delight, surprise and amaze. We are asking all staff and parents to be mindful that there are families and children in our community who are dealing with information that their children could be affected, and may be experiencing anxieties. We all need to keep this in mind when discussing this incident.

Kiss and Drop Zone

Lately we have had a few comments from parents who are frustrated with the wait at the Kiss and Drop zone. We have observed that the traffic hold up is occurring before the bell and for the first 5 minutes after the bell while students are making their way to the pick-up zone after the bell. We suggest if you regularly have to wait in the queue, that you arrange with your children to pick them up a few minutes later, especially if you find your children are frequently not yet at the pick-up zone when you arrive.

The area is supervised until 3.30 (3.15 on Wednesdays), and presently there are almost no cars left by about 3.25pm, so you may find you arrive in a 'stress-free' zone if you arrange to come that little bit later. If you do find you have to wait, please do not pull out on the other side of the road to pass cars. There have been a couple of 'near misses' where students have almost been hit due to drivers pulling out at the same time children are getting into cars on the road side of the car.

We know that waiting can be frustrating at times, but we need to all work together to make sure our children are safe.
