Mrs Murphy informs me that our students have a great attitude in PE. They are willing to challenge themselves, participate in all activities and put in their best. They will have a go at new and challenging skills.
Cross Country: Currently 50 students are training for the SAPSASA Cross Country which will be held on Tuesday 2nd July. Mrs Murphy reported that 48 of these students were out training after school on Tuesday, and there were many parent helpers. With such a fabulous attitude, how can we not succeed?

Thank you to parents who have let us know their concerns about pedestrian safety around the school. We are working hard to investigate solutions to the following issues:

- Cars are 'banking up' in the Kiss and Drop zones on William and Baker streets, causing frustration for local residents and parents needing to get through
- Parents are stopping on the road or on the other side of the street (in the 'no stopping' zone) and calling out for their children to get in the car, stopping traffic and sometimes putting children in danger
- Children are having difficulty crossing the road on Baker Street and Darnley Street at the recommended crossing points due to heavy traffic, the confusion caused by cars coming from different directions, poor visibility around parked cars and drivers not slowing down to $25 \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{hr}$.
We met with traffic officers from Mount Barker Council this week and they advised us that cars must not to stop in the road waiting for the Kiss and Drop to clear, and that cars waiting in the Kiss and Drop zone before $3: 15 \mathrm{pm}$ for more than 2 minutes waiting for the bell is also contributing to the problem. Officers will be present in the coming weeks to move traffic along and explain the traffic rules to families. They will also be monitoring cars parking on verges, etc.
If you can wait a few minutes before arriving at the Kiss and Drop, that would help as well, since the biggest problem time is from about $3.05-3.20 \mathrm{pm}$.


## We have included a brochure from the Council to explain traffic rules around schools.

***Please note that we have been advised by Council that cars are meant to STOP for pedestrians crossing at the indicated crossing points at an intersection, in our case the intersection of Baker and Darnley Streets. Most cars are not presently doing this. If you are driving near the school, please keep your eyes out for students wanting to cross, and if safe stop and allow them to cross. Parents and Caregivers of students crossing, please teach your children how to cross safely at these intersections. In particular practise waiting to see if a car is actually stopping (ie not to just walk out and hope this will happen), and also checking carefully that traffic coming from the other direction is actually stopping as well. ***
We are also investigating a "koala" or "emu" crossing to go in front of the school, which many schools find very helpful in assisting students to cross safely.
The viability of this is dependent on the number of people we actually have crossing Baker Street on an average day. We are now looking to collect some data on this. If you would be willing to count and record pedestrians crossing Baker Street before or after school one day a week, that would be a great help. Please leave your name and number with Debbie at the front office and we will get back to you.
