NAPLAN

On **Tuesday 13, Wednesday 14 and Thursday 15 May**, students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will take part in the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy, or NAPLAN, as it is commonly known.

Skills that will be tested include: reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation, and numeracy.

These tests are done here at school and are considered just another part of the curriculum. Students with disability may qualify for reasonable adjustments that reflect the support normally provided to them in the classroom. Some students with very specific circumstances may be exempted from participating in the tests.

It is important for you and your child to know that NAPLAN is not a pass/fail test. It simply looks at what level students are achieving in literacy and numeracy against National Standards and compared with student peers throughout Australia.

NAPLAN cannot be studied for and students are not expected to do so. The best way you can help your child prepare for NAPLAN is to let them know that it is just a routine part of their school program, and to urge them to do the best they can on the day.

All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 are expected to participate in NAPLAN testing. Later in the year we will send parents an individual student NAPLAN report that you can use to view and monitor how your child is progressing.

Preparing Children for the Tests

At Littlehampton we have a very good record of attendance for NAPLAN tests. Parents and teachers value these tests as they show a snapshot of what students can achieve, and they also enable parents and teachers to see progress over time. Each year we aim for 100% participation, and each year we achieve this for many tests for each year levels. The best way that parents can assist children to prepare for the tests is to ensure they get a good night's sleep, and come to the test with a good breakfast and a positive attitude. Encourage children to do their best, but not to worry or become anxious if there is something they cannot do, because there probably will be things they cannot do. Next week, teachers will also assist students to be settled, and a big focus for NAPLAN week at school is maintaining a settled environment.

State Day Swimming Championships

On Friday 21st March Littlehampton had 4 students represent Barker District at the State Day Swimming Championships at Marion Pool. They were Ben and Sophie Barrow and Zara and Dylan McCauley. They had a very successful day. Barker came 4th overall out of 18 schools.

Sophie came 4th in the 100m freestyle and 2nd (Silver Medal) in the 50m backstroke. Ben received 2 bronze medals for Butterfly and Open Medal relay. Dylan received a silver medal for the freestyle relay.

Congratulations to all four students who represented the school and district in an exemplary manner.

Congratulations must go to Cooper Hough also for making the SAPSASA Barker Football Team who will be

Years 5 and 6 students become clever sculptors!

In the last week of term one Mrs Bishop's and Mr Davies year 4/5 classes went on an excursion to The Cedars Hahndorf, home of the late Sir Hans Hevsen where the second Adelaide Hills International Sculpture Symposium was held. This year the organisers offered schools the opportunity to not only visit the event but to see the eight internationally renowned sculptors sculpting their large pieces of granite or marble stone. One of the sculptures students saw being made will soon be installed in our town at Willow Park, North Terrace. In a similar event in 2012, 8 sculptures were made at the first symposium event and are in towns within the Mount Lofty Ranges, while each of the 8 sculptures we saw being made will go in other towns.



But the highlight was each of our students participating in a free workshop led by an artist. In the well organised workshop, student each was given a block of Gambier Mount limestone and bv

using a range of tools provided for them, they were able to sculpt a shape of their choice. Every child was fully engaged throughout the short 1 ¹/₂ hour session and some magnificent sculptures were made. We will display some of the sculptures in the school from week 2 for 3 weeks.

Coinciding with this event was the Adelaide Sculpture Biennale where throughout the hectares of the beautifully gum tree studded landscape of The Cedars, students were able to find 38 sculptures. This diverse display offered our students the opportunity to discover sculpture in many different materials, ideas, sizes and sensations.
