# MGM MESSAGING SYSTEM Important information for all families

As mentioned in our Term 2 Week 10 Newsletter, we have now activated our MGM Text Messaging system. On Friday August 1st one parent from each family should have received 2 test messages from the school; if your family did not receive a message, please notify us immediately as a matter of importance. It is imperative that we have your mobile contact details accurate and that the correct member of the family is receiving the information as this will now be our method of communicating unexplained absences but importantly, our Bushfire / Emergency alert messages. Our current point of contact is the family member who was listed as the Parent / Guardian #1 on your child's enrolment form. Should you wish to change who the text messages are delivered to, please notify us.

This text messaging system is now available for you to conveniently inform us of your child's absence. The number you need to text to is 0427 016 460. This is for texting absences/lateness only, any other messages to teachers and communication needs to be phoned through on the main number or emailed to the class teacher. If your child is late, they are still required to sign in at the Front Office.

When you text us, please state School name (LPS), Student name, Student class, Absence date and Absence reason. The message needs to be sent to us prior to 9.00 am on the day of absence otherwise you will receive a text message stating an unexplained absence.

We hope this system will successfully assist parents in conveniently communicating with the school.
