Students take part in the Oliphant Science Awards



The Oliphant Science Awards is an annually held competition for South Australian school students from Reception to Year 12. It aims to develop their interest in science through a science based competition with a range of categories to suit a wide variety of abilities and interests. Learning science encourages students

to develop a range of skills such as observation, prediction and communication as well as expanding their knowledge within and between the diverse domains of science. The South Australian Science Teachers Association (SASTA) has conducted The Oliphant Science Awards every year since their inception in 1981, with Sir Mark Oliphant the patron of this competition which is named in his honour and runs with his legacy.



This year Littlehampton had a total of 20 enthusiastic young scientists take part in what was the biggest competition since its inception, with over 2000 entries from schools throughout South Australia.

Our students demonstrated a great deal of focus and dedication while creating their entries, with many taking a term to complete. Entries ranged from erupting volcanoes and catapults to solar powered chicken feeders and models of

the respiratory system. The standard of work produced by the students was outstanding.

Judging of the competition took place on Saturday 23rd August at the Thebarton Community Centre. Littlehampton were lucky enough to have two students receive Highly Commended Awards for their entries. Congratulations to Emmy Roach and Jimmy Lynch for what is an amazing achievement.

Reminder: Hat Policy in place




We would like to remind parents/ caregivers that as from Monday 1st September our Hat Policy will be in place again for this year.

Fundraising Forum

Food Policy Questionnaire Results

Thank you to the families who replied to the questionnaire in our last newsletter to inform our new Food Policy.



The results are as follows:

1. Does your child bring uneaten food home from school?

OFTEN 32% SOMETIMES 39% RARELY 29%

The main reason stated by parents that children are bringing food home is that they do not have enough time to eat (57%). We are currently trialling a number of different solutions to parents' concerns about students not eating, including a set eating time at recess with a bell (there is no defined recess time at present, although most teachers usually allow time for this), children eating in their own classrooms, greater supervision during eating times, quiet eating times, and listening to music or a story/ class novel during this time. Staff will make a decision about whether there will be any changes to current routines in the coming weeks. Please note that the 10 minutes at lunch when students eat is actually 'teaching time' and does not impact on their socialising break time of 40 minutes after the bell.

2. Are you in favour of dropping the tradition of students bringing in birthday treats to share with the whole class, in favour of an individual celebration for that child only in form of a treat or a birthday hat or badge to wear for the day?

YES 61% NO 25% UNSURE 14%

Since the majority of parents are in favour of this change, we will recommend to Governing Council that this be put in place from the beginning of 2015. If your child still has not had a birthday this year, you are welcome to send along cakes or treats if this is what you normally do.

We thank you all for your helpful comments and suggestions. One parent suggested that we host a parent info session on low-cost healthy food preparations that children can be involved with, and we are investigating this for Term 4. Until then, 'Bon Appétit!'
