Community Wellbeing Seminar



On Monday 2nd March Littlehampton Primary School will be hosting a Growth & Development Family Evening in our Resource Centre. We are really pleased to be able to offer this service, since parents

have been asking us for just such an evening to help them know how to introduce the 'Facts of Life' to their children.

The sessions are conducted by Kidz Biz Ed and are designed to be fun, informative and easy to understand. These highly interactive sessions will provide students and their parents/caregivers with an introduction to basic personal and social development education.

There will be 2 sessions run on the evening and the topics covered in each are:

6.40pm: Where Did We Come From? (Rec to Yr 4)

7.40pm: What's Happening to Us? (Years 5 to 7)

The duration of each session will be approximately 50 minutes.

New Food Policy

Enclosed with this newsletter you will find the school's new Food Policy, developed last year by a committee of staff and parents from P & F and Governing Council. We surveyed all families and we thank those who responded for your thoughtful contributions. The resulting Policy reflects the view of the majority of parents who responded, and was voted in by Governing Council late last year. You will note that there are a few changes of practice in the new Policy:

- students may choose to bring a 'Fruit and Veg snack' to class. Teachers will let parents and students know when they will have this snack time in the day. Please note that the only foods suitable for this snack are unprocessed raw Fruit and Veg; items such as yoghurts and dried fruits are unsuitable for this optional snack but are fine for recess or lunch.
- We ask families not to send birthday treats for the class to celebrate their child's birthday. Class teachers will decide on a way to celebrate each child's birthday, with a birthday hat or song, for example, or with a treat for that individual child. Class teachers will let the children know what they can expect on their special day.

Please note that there are no regulations for which foods children bring to school for recess and lunch but we encourage parents to refer to the Rite Bite Policy of sending mostly 'Green' foods (see back of Food Policy), and in particular to avoid sending items high in sugar, such as juices or sweets. Teachers always notice how these items affect children's ability to concentrate and learn. We thank families for complying with our new Food Policy!

Mount Barker Gawler Street Art Trail

Responding to Abuse and Neglect training

All volunteers in our school are required by DECD to undertake training in Responding to Abuse and Neglect before they are able to begin volunteering. This is a free service provided by Margie Sarre or Jenny Lewis at school, in the form of a one hour workshop. There are two workshops coming up on Tuesday February 17th at 2pm and 6 pm. We encourage all parents wishing to help out with reading, LAP, Kitchen Garden or any other school program to register for one of these workshops by leaving their name with Debbie at the front office.

Learning Assistance Program

The Learning Assistance Program (LAP) is set up in schools where volunteers, in partnership with teaching staff, work with students on a one-to-one basis, for a regular session each week. The significant individual time creates more learning situations where students can experience success and supports their achievement at school.

The volunteer becomes the student's friend and mentor sharing the challenge and excitement of learning through a variety of experiences. The LAP program is a vital part of our children's learning that requires many volunteers, the more volunteers the more children we can help.

Your support in the LAP program will be very valuable and appreciated by all of the students and teachers.

Multilit Program

(Making up for lost time in literacy)

Our school also offers another one to one program to support children with an explicit focus on Phonic awareness and sight words. Volunteers are also needed to work within this program for 30 minutes a week.
