Physically Active... Three Great Programs!

We all know how important it is to be physically fit, and teaching our students skills as well as



fitness is the primary goal of our Physical Education program at Littlehampton. Last week you received information about the Premier's Be Active Challenge, which is one great program to encourage our students to be physically active. Our swimming program in which all students from Reception to Year 5 participate, is another. The third is a new program that has been introduced to replace the Active After School Program which operated at Littlehampton Primary School for the last 8 years, the Sporting Schools Australia Program.

Sporting Schools Australia

Our school has been selected as a pilot school for this new program. Only 8 schools have been selected in the state for this honour, and we are the only school outside the metropolitan area. Inclusion in the program means:

- annual funding so we can provide up to three terms of sport-based activity for children at a time that suits our school (we have chosen during school time)
- free quality online sporting resources and lesson plans
- professional development opportunities for our teachers and school staff
- information about sports and community facilities within our local area
- specialist Sporting Schools staff around Australia to help us get the most out of the program.

The class which has been selected for this special program this term is Sue Close's Year 2 class which is receiving special development workshops in cricket over a 6 week period. Each term a different sport, class and year level will be chosen to participate. In addition to cricket this term 4 more classes will participate in 4 football clinics provided by a specialist football coach. Those classes will be Sara's, Danielle's, Mrs Bevan's and Mrs K's.





Our Year 6 & 7's will be taking part in two Aquatics Days up at the Murraylands Aquatics Centre on Thursday 12th and Friday 13th March.



School Leadership presentation at the Positive Education Schools Association

Last Friday Margie Sarre and Jenny Lewis presented a workshop at St Peters College for the Positive Education Schools Association. The presentation was well attended, and was an outline of our journey at Littlehampton in introducing Positive Education and Positive Psychology. The Premier's Reading Challenge

The Premier's Reading Challenge has started. Many teachers incorporate it into their reading programs or at home reading requirements. The purpose is to get children reading and to be rewarded for their efforts.

Basically, the Premier's Reading Challenge sheet has 2 parts. In the top section of the sheet, students need to read 8 books from an extensive list. In our Library, we have the books marked with square stickers on the spine label: R-2 = orange, Years 3-5 = green, Year 6-9 = fluoro yellow. You may have some books at home that are on the list or you can borrow from the local library but you would need to check that these are books from the Premier's Reading Challenge List, by asking or checking the website.

It can be tricky for the older students as often only one book is listed but the whole series may be able to be listed – please ask.

In the bottom part of the sheet, students need to read either 4 more from the list or 4 more books of their choice or if you are in Reception or Year 1, you could add 4 of your readers.



Please help younger children to write in the names and authors of the books as the Library Staff have to check every entry to make sure it is correct — we do get audited — before they can be signed off. A big problem in the past has been students losing their forms. Encourage a safe place for these.

The Premier's Reading Challenge finishes on 4th September, but start soon so that we aren't rushing at the last minute. In 2014, we had 79.36% of the students complete the Challenge and receive an award. Wouldn't it be great to have over 80%!

2015 Material & Service Fees



Payment of 2015 Material and Services fees of \$290 was due in full on Saturday 28th February unless arrangements had been made to pay by instalments.

If paying by instalments your first payment was also due on 28/2/15.

Your \$100 (\$70 for approved school card families) Gym donation can be paid at any time but we encourage families to pay this early as our first payment of \$6682.92 is due 15/3/15 and we rely on your contribution to meet our repayments of \$26731.68 each year. Thank you to those families who have already paid.

We would like to ask parents to make payments at the school office when dropping children at school in the morning. The school office is open from 8am. This will allow us to bank earlier in the day and avoid holding cash in the office during the day

A reminder that you can pay via the internet BSB 105-025, account number 115 050 84 and quote your family code and student's name if space available. Other payment options are: cash, cheque, Eftpos (in person, by phone or completing the tear off slip at the bottom of your invoice).

If applying for School Card, please complete the application form and return it to the school office now. School Card is not available for preschool students.

Preschool fees were also due on 28/2/15 and if you have overlooked this payment please pay at the school office now. Instalment plans are available for preschool fees but you need to attend to this now.

Readers



Part of school life for younger students is having a reader. Over many years, the school has worked towards building up a collection of readers from a variety of schemes and

publishers, to cater for the needs of our students and the objectives of the teachers.

At times, readers do become worn out or damaged. If this happens, please alert your child's teacher so that we know to order a replacement or possibly repair the damage. However, our biggest concern is the number of readers that go missing.

At the end of 2014 we were missing 144 readers!! The readers are valued at approximately \$10 each, so if we are to replace those readers, we are already \$1440 into the Early Years budget. This is money that could be spent on other educational items for your children.

We would ask you all to have a look in bedrooms, book shelves, book baskets in cars, likely spots and unlikely spots for readers that may be hiding.

The challenge for the parents of Littlehampton Primary School is to find and return as many of the Lost 2014 readers as you can. Hopefully we will be able to report some progress in a future Newsletter.
