Inquiry-based Learning

"Give the pupils something to do, not something to learn; and the doing is of such a nature as to demand thinking; learning naturally results." — John Dewey

Our children are born with an overwhelming need to ask questions about the world around them and seek answers. This curiosity all begins with the moment they realise the magic that is their fingers and toes and then continues to grow as they do. As adults we need to foster and encourage our children's inquisitive nature and use it as a teaching tool with endless potential. An inquiry-based approach to teaching and learning can increase

the engagement of children in their learning and foster a deeper understanding through the development of a hands-on, minds-on and research-based disposition towards teaching and learning.

At Littlehampton our curriculum is enriched using this inquiry based approach. Our students are encouraged to:

- tackle real-world questions, issues and controversies
- develop questioning, research and communication skills
- solve problems or create solutions
- collaborate within and beyond the classroom
- develop deep understanding of content knowledge

Training the Teachers On June 9, our school had a Pupil Free Day, and our teachers received a refresher course in Inquiry Learning. Our trainer, Tori Weiss, as well as reminding teachers of Inquiry Processes and of the important of planning and assessment tasks, sent teachers out into the community to learn by direct experience. Teachers then came back to discuss how they used the inquiry process and what they learned, and outlined key learnings about process which they will use with children. Teachers researched... and enjoyed researching:

- What makes a good barista? Thanks to Ben and Michelle Gore for the direct experience!
- What are grasses, how are they different from other plants? Thanks to The Garden Depot.
- What makes a weed? We found the answer at the Natural Resource Centre in Mt Barker.
- Why do people keep pets? Thanks to Mt Barker Pet Care.
- What can you discover at the local library? We discovered a wonderful archivist, Rhiannon Agutter who helped us research early Littlehampton teachers.

The purpose was to inspire teachers to use direct experience in teaching our students.

Camps This week rooms 6, 8, 10, 11 and 12 headed off to Arbury Park to take part in a truly amazing inquiry-based learning opportunity. The children will take part in many hands-on experiences that will enable them to search for answers to their questions. The impact a learning experience such as this can have on a child is immeasurable and it

sets the stage for a lifetime of invaluable learning experiences.
