Showcases. This was our biggest Showcase ever, with over 215 students performing and over 400 in the audience. The night was a great success. Two weeks ago our school choir performed at the Festival of

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### Tournament of Minds Congratulations

Senior students in our school have many ways in which they can represent our school at a state level. It may be through the Festival of Music or SAPSASA sport – or by competing in the Tournament of Minds (TOM).

On Sunday 13th September, 19 students represented our school at Flinders University - and they did us proud.

TOM requires students to work in a small team over 6 weeks. They receive a complex problem, which they need to break into components, find creative yet realistic solutions, script their solution, construct props and costumes and perform in front of judges, families and other schools. It also involves an unseen (spontaneous) problem which they need to solve on the day in just 5 minutes.

This competition develops the skills students need to take into the workforce – initiative, teamwork, open-mindedness, ability to generate ideas, thinking outside the square, clear communication and meeting set criteria. Many of these are skills machines and robots are yet to master; which is why they are the skills of a future workforce.

TOM has been operational in SA for 25 years and it is open to all primary schools and high schools in our state – public, private and catholic. Competition is determined as many schools enjoy the prestige of winning an intellectual competition. Students can elect to compete in one of 4 categories; Applied Technology, Maths Engineering, Language and Literature, Social Sciences.

This year we were represented in the Social Sciences by Paris Samwell, Lucy Hong, Sophia Dvorak, Tahnee Adams, Amy Jocks and Cai Staunton. Their challenge was to select 3 notable historical figures from a short list (supplied) and learn about their achievements. They then needed to have these leaders face off in a reality style TV show to erase the weakest link from History.

We were represented in the Applied Technology challenge by Mitchell Streng, Annie Krop, Oscar Hong, Zach Bell, Cooper Clarke and Nicholas Possingham. Their challenge was to find a classroom problem (they chose the winter flu) and use a designated Meccano set to make a device to help solve this problem. They then had to learn computer coding for how this device would be programmed and sell the valuable features of this device to the judges via a slide show presentation.



We were also represented in the Language and Literature discipline by Ethan Roberts, Sophie Barrow, Samuel Lanes, Dhiren Karunanithi-Carter, Levi Roberts, Darcy Hutchinson and Ben Barrow. This team had to explore the books and characters of Aaron Blabey, decide upon a character and their motive for the "blabbing" of a new book and re-write the story line with adapted content.

All 3 teams performed strongly and gave confident, prepared and enjoyable to watch performances. Each group managed to create a story line the audience could

follow, addressed the set criteria and participated in fantastic spirit.

Congratulations are in order for all, with a special congratulations to our Language and Literature team whose hilarious and criteria focussed solution was exceptional and earned them (and our school) Honours for being among the very best teams in the competition.
