Parents, Please Support our Litter Free Lunches

To Littlehampton's shame, a neighbour has written a letter to me and to the Governing Council, complaining about the litter that blows into his yard from the school. This has been accompanied by a bag of litter. Three such bags have been supplied over the past 6 months. These bags are mainly chip and snack packets sent from home, and ziplock plastic bags. Undoubtedly this is packaging sent by parents with their children's lunches. While other litter is found which originates from school not home (such as paper), this does not seem to be blown into our neighbours' yards. It is the light snack packaging and zip lock bags that seem to travel, the school based waste stays in the yard.


Litter in the yard, and blowing onto the verges has long been a problem at Littlehampton PS, and various strategies have been tried in order to manage it.

- Students have been taught about the environment, and the importance of reducing waste, recycling and re-using materials.
- Students are taught about the harm that can occur to native animals and fish when litter enters our waterways via drains, and ends up in the oceans and streams
- School rules have been implemented stating no food is to be eaten on the oval, and students are not to drop litter anywhere except in the bin.
- Regular yard clean ups are implemented, and awards given to the class who keeps the cleanest area.
- We have a policy of Litter Free lunches with awards given to the classes who bring the least packaging from home.
- A rubbish bin is taken out to the oval daily and wheeled in at night, so that children have access to bins, just in case.

Unfortunately, none of these seem to have had any impact on the litter problem.

It's time to get serious about dealing with litter..... In Japan, there are no rubbish bins, and there is also no litter. They have a seriously implemented culture of not leaving litter behind. Everyone takes their litter home, to dispose of in their own house. No-one walks past a piece of litter... instead they stop to pick it up, regardless of who dropped it. That's what it might take to stop litter at Littlehampton.

Rubbish Collected Over Nine Days



Total rubbish pieces collected: 291 In Oval, Yard, Junior & Molly Miels Lunch Sheds and around Room 10 - *Graph by Jordan Hunter* For the past 9 days Mrs. Chatfield's class has been recording rubbish in the yard and has hung the rubbish up on posters for all the children to see. The posters have been hung in the JP lunch shed and outside Mrs. Chatfield's classroom.

The rubbish each day is sorted into different categories. The 5 categories are plastic bags, chip packets, paper/foil, food scraps and other plastic packaging/wrapping. Over the past 9 days they have found 291 pieces of rubbish. In conclusion we want you to STOP packing litter in your child's lunch box because we want the school to be as clean as possible.

Ninjago Trading



What teachers and students will do at school:


- We have introduced a daily collection of litter with the daily safety inspections of the yard. Instead of disposing of this litter it is kept, mounted on 'shame boards', photographed, and logged on data sheets, so we can keep track. This is done by Mrs Chatfield's class & the Wipe out Waste Forum Group.
- The Wipe Out Waste group has implemented a once a week litter collection from verges and footpaths along Darnley and William Street where the worst litter collects. Thanks Mrs Chatfield for supervising forum members to do this.
- Students are involved in working with the data collected as outlined in Kade's column on page 1. Some of the Year 6 students data analysis appears in this newsletter. Thank you Year 6 students.

- Parents, please do not walk past a piece of litter!



Influenza and your Child

We have recently also have several confirmed cases of flu in the school. Symptoms are:

- sudden onset of fever,
- headaches,
- muscle ache,
- fatigue,
- runny nose,
- sore throat

Influenza is a notifiable disease. Children with Influenza must stay home from school until well, which is between 2 and 7 days.

A diagnoses is best confirmed by laboratory tests that can be organised by your child's doctor.

How can flu be prevented?

The spread of influenza is prevented by WASH, WIPE, COVER. This is:

- Washing hands as soon as possible after sneezing or coughing and after contact with nose and throat discharges
- Wiping down all frequently touched surfaces regularly with cleaning cloth and detergent
- Cover—children are taught to cover nose and mouth with clothing (eg elbow), not hands nowadays.
