What Do You think of Us.... School Surveys cont.

The surveys results are outlined in full here. The right hand chart indicates how parents have responded over the past 3 years, and the left hand, for students in the past two years. Scores for both surveys over 4.0 out of a possible 5 indicate that parents (or students) consider we are doing this very well, and these have been shaded in yellow. Each year we take the opportunity to ask parents some school specific questions that will help us with our planning. This appears at the top. This year scores are generally higher than last year, though there are some notable exceptions. We are especially concerned about the student response to the statement "I can talk to my teachers about my concerns". Further analysis shows the while 65% of students agree or strongly agree with this statement, 24% neither agree nor disagree, and 13% disagree or strongly disagree. This is an area staff will be looking to address in the next year. Other areas for

improvement from the parent survey and comments are:

- Knowing about the strategies used by teachers in Positive Education
- Keeping parents informed and seeking their opinion
- Recognising Academic Achievement
- Communications, including via email
- Oval maintenance
- Recognising indigenous perspective in history
- Technology programs— more computers
- Uniform policy
- Several comments and questions on the French program (which will be addressed in more detail next year)
- Relief teachers... wish for not so many. (This will also be addressed in more detail in a future article)

The survey also included two complaints of a relatively serious nature, and we would encourage the parents who made this complaint to contact the school as we are keen to do something about it.
